Aim of the course	Acquainting the students with basic artistic and painting issues, such as composition, colour, visual dominant, chiaroscuro Improvement of painting techniques using basic materials: oil paint, acrylic paint and tempera Development of artistic awareness
Prerequisites	Ability to analyse still lifes and their colouristic and compositional values Ability to paint/draw the nude (proper anatomy and proportions) Gaining knowledge about the possibilities of the painting language
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	The student has the knowledge of: - painting as an artistic medium, - proper planning of a painting, including dynamics and statics of a composition and space built by colour.
– skills	The student: - uses basic painting techniques, - translates their studio experience into their own work, - creates painting notes, sketches, landscape studies, - attempts to define their own artistic predispositions through the realisation of specific topics and problem tasks.
– personal and social competence	The students: - properly assesses their own work, - actively participates in the working critiques, - is involved in the life of the studio and academy.
Course content	Painting as a communication medium Creating individual artistic statements based on the observation of nature
Course form and number of course hours	10 hours/week Classes take place at specific hours. The course comprises exercises and regular individual consultations during the semester.
Assessment methods and criteria	The final grade is a combination of gained skills, realisation of tasks, individual character of painting interpretations and active participation in every studio class.
