Aim of the course	Introduction of specialized vocabulary and artistic language. Acquisition of the skill to use the specialized language in the scope of four basic language competencies: speaking, listening, writing and reading. Acquisition of the skill to communicate in the field of a general language at the elementary level, based on the handbook „Eurolingua Deutsch“.
Prerequisites	Elementary level of German (A2).
Learning outcomes:	
- <i>knowledge</i>	The student has a basic knowledge of the language necessary for describing the creative and artistic processes of various artistic techniques.
- <i>skills</i>	The student can independently analyze the artistic specialized text in German of a low degree of difficulty. They have knowledge of a basic vocabulary and can apply it to expressing opinions on art in the form of both, writing and speaking.
- <i>personal and social competence</i>	The student can present their own artistic works and communicate in the scope of basic themes of art. They are prepared to take part in scholarship programmes and students exchange (Erasmus programme).
