Aim of the course	Students learn about art of medieval Europe. Getting familiar with the social and political context of art, as well as its role in promoting ideas of Christianity. Raising awareness of characteristic elements of style of specific epochs and their permanent achievements in art and architecture. Developing analytical and critical skills regarding the heritage of past times.
Prerequisites	General knowledge of history resulting from secondary education.

Learning outcomes:

- knowledge	Basic knowledge in the area of history of medieval art.
- skills	Student has the ability to distinguish specific epochs in medieval art, including artworks by main artists: paintings, sculptures, architecture. Student can critically reinterpret historic forms when creating new visual qualities.
- personal and social competence	Student can analyze works of ancient art regarding form and style, can form and express judgements about ancient works of art, student is aware of

	complexity of problems in shaping of specific historic epochs.
Course content	<p>Subjects include:</p> <p>Early Christian art: construction and space, painterly decorations – style, influences, symbols; early Christian sculpture: selected examples of Christian sarcophagi – themes, style; architecture, churches, mosaics, decorations – characteristics and ideology, sources of style.</p> <p>Early Roman art: architecture, crosses, celtic sculptures, early handwritings – styles and influences; early Roman architecture, churches, monasteries, characteristics and local developments, models of complex monasteries.</p> <p>Roman architecture: evolution of form in German and French architecture, characteristic features of regional types of architecture based on selected examples of churches and cathedrals.</p> <p>Roman sculpture: beginnings of architectural Roman sculpture – influences and style, Spanish sculpture, cathedrals, architectural Italian sculpture, sculpture in bronze.</p> <p>Roman painting: characteristic features and sources of style in Roman paintings, frescoes, church decorations, cloth paintings – characteristics of style and realization based on selected examples.</p> <p>Gothic architecture: ideas, symbols, construction of a gothic temple; evolution of style and building techniques based on selected examples in France; gothic architecture in England, Italy, european painting during Middle Ages.</p> <p>Gothic sculpture: evolution of form based on examples of churches, cathedrals, sculptures on graves; Italian, German sculpture on selected examples.</p> <p>Gothic painting: development of presenting space and silhouette in gothic painting based on selected examples, early portrait painting, symbols in gothic painting.</p> <p>Early Roman art, Roman and Gothic art in Poland: first christian churches in Poland, Roman architecture heritage, characteristic features, influences of western art, symbols, Polish gothic cathedrals, local features of gothic architecture in Poland, wall painting, sculpture.</p> <p>Art of medieval Wrocław: church architecture in churches such as św. Wojciech, św. Krzyż, NMPanny na Piasku, cathedral of św. Jan Chrzciciel, painting and church sculpture: frescoes from św. Jan Chrzciciel, gothic altars, architectural sculpture of Wrocław's cathedral, Ratusz – city hall – architecture and sculptural decorations.</p>
Course form and number of course hours	Classes are in form of illustrated lectures, during which students are encouraged to analyze the examples presented. Visits to museum exhibitions and galleries.
Assessment methods and criteria	25% active participation in classes 75% final exam
