| Course type | Specialty course, compulsory course. |
| Year of study/semester; Type of studies | Year III, semester 5; full time master's degree studies |

| Aim of the course | Consolidation of professional terminology, the rules of describing ceramic and glass objects, procedures of making conservation documentation in a scientific and research layer. |
| Prerequisites | The II year's classes passed. |
| Learning outcomes: | |
| – knowledge | The student knows the documentation terminology and has an extended knowledge of the procedures of documentary description, a graphic record, stratigraphy construction, analysis of the object in terms of a form and state of preservation. They have knowledge of the principles of a scientific query. |
| – skills | The student can analyze the object in a descriptive and graphic way, in compliance with the conservation documentation procedure. They are able to perform a routine query in a research block. They can independently build stratigraphic tables. They are able to combine data from queries, formal, stylistic and drawing descriptions into a substantively correct elaboration. They make their first attempts of independent editing of the documentation text in a formal and stylistic layer. |
| - personal and social competence | The student sees the need for exchange of information in the group and teamwork. They practice their sense of observation, analysis and reasoning ability. |
| Course content | The methodology and procedures of recording conservation documentation: working, pre- executive and post-executive version. Exercises of describing historical objects: formal and stylistic description, state of preservation, stratigraphy (utility ceramics, archit. detail, glass object, stained glass, tiles, mosaic). Research blocks in the conservation documentation. Documentary drawing of the objects, as above. Keeping a conservation journal. Preliminary editing of the documentation text, combined with the lectures and consultations in studios and labs. |
| Course form and number of course hours | Lectures and exercises, 15 hours/sem. |
| Assessment methods and criteria | Semester 5: 50% executing assignments /25% active participation in classes / 25% exercises. |
| Assessment type | Semester 5: graded pass. |
