Aim of the course	Ability to create one's own scenography projects, including virtual scenography to fictional film and for television based on accurate reading of script. Execution of one's own scenography design, including virtual scenography, based on chosen script. Presenting the project in comprehensible, interesting form.
Prerequisites	Broad interest in all areas of art, especially fictional film and theatre. Good knowledge about movements in art and new artistic trends, especially in the area of cinematography. Independence in searching and documenting potential film settings. Very good knowledge of the art of computer design, and ability to use a camera and photo camera.
Learning outcomes:	

- knowledge

Student gains complete knowledge about designing and executing a scenography project, including virtual scenography to fictional and television films, creative analysis of a script and screenplay, making photo documentation of a scenography.

- skills

Students learns all skills necessary to creatively design scenography for film and television, including virtual scenography, based on knowledge and practice gained during execution of their own projects.

personal and social competence

Student gains knowledge in the area of film art, understanding of scenographer's role in film and television. Can express judgements and critique. Understands the need to work in team and can be a team leader. Can present their project in a convincing manner.

Course content

Preparing documentation of scenography design, project and execution of it, including virtual scenography, to a short film based on chosen script, in cooperation with Wrocław School of Filmmaking Mastershot and Audiovisual Technology Center in Wrocław. Presenting the project in a comprehensible and artistically appealing manner.

Course form and number of course hours

Lectures, individual project consultations, project production on a film set. 8 hours per week (sem. IX) and 11 hours per week (sem. X).

Assessment methods and criteria

50 % executing assignments / active participation in classes / working reviews 50 % open critique of works
