Course content

Classicist architecture:

influence of archaeological discoveries, spatial city planning, architecture in England, Germany, France, based on selected examples.

Classicist painting:

search for a new painting, art of selected artists, influence of French and English artists and thinkers, heroic landscape.

Classicisst and romantic sculpture:

antique sculpture and new form of sculpture at the beginning of 19th century, development of portrait sculpture, romantism.

Classicism in Poland:

shaping of a new taste, classicist houses, projects by significant artists.

Classicism in Wrocław:

urban architecture in Wrocław between 18th and 19th century, city palace in the epoch; buildings, houses representing classicist style.

German romantism and romantic architecture in Europe:

art by main representatives of this movement, influence on shaping the romantic style, art of palaces and gardens, monumental architecture and its romantic vision.

"Dark romantism" and realism in painting:

art by main representatives, most important visions of realism.

Impressionism:

roots of impressionism, influence of photography and japanese woodcut on new painting, evolution of impressionism based on main examples. Cubism, Bauhaus, abstract and non-representative art.

Course form and number of course hours

Classes are in form of illustrated lectures, during which students are encouraged to analyze the examples presented. Visits to museum exhibitions and galleries.
