Aim of the course	Development of sensitivity, imagination, professional skills and artistic consciousness leading to the formation of an independent creative attitude and original artistic personality Creating independent and valuable modes of artistic expression
Prerequisites	The student has to possess an ability to study, interpret and transpose nature.
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	The student has advanced knowledge of the process of artistic creation, visual perception and the painter's workshop.
– skills	The student easily, independently and consciously uses workshop skills and painting techniques/technologies.
– personal and social competence	The student critically interprets the picture, expresses opinions and critical judgements about paintings, including their own artistic experiments.

Course form and number of course hours	Classes in painting studio. Weekly: 9 hours
