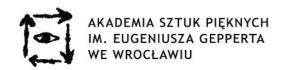

Aim of the course	 To acquaint students with the differences in the structure of the system of linguistic and iconic signs. Introduction to anthropology of image and anthropology of word - the scope and cognitive abilities. Presentation of selected issues relating to the specific word and image coexistence. To acquaint students with the construction of verbal and visual expressions and methods of their translatability.
Prerequisites	Openness to diversity of arts and cultural phenomena; attitude of tolerance and commitment; cognitive desire and creativity.
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	The student - knows the structural differences of language and iconic characters - gains knowledge of word and image anthropology - knows how to apply the acquired information in their own artistic practice
– skills	- The student - has an improved ability to create artistic expressions based on different possibilities of language and iconic signs - knows how to make an analysis of texts and visual works - is able to create his own collection of works, giving it the character of a coherent expression
– personal and social competence	The student - can work in a team - can use the acquired knowledge in dialogue and argumentation of their own theses
Course content	The structure of language and iconic characters - selected issues.
	Anthropology of the image by Belting. Anthropology of the word - contemporary research.
	Literature and the arts in relation to oral and verbal tradition. Semantic decoherence of concrete poetry.
	Liberature as a total work. From Joyce to liberature. New language-iconic codes.
	From papyrus to hypertext. Ergodic text, cybertext - multi-level expression.
Course form and number of course hours	4 hours/week 8 hours/week Classes are theoretical and workshop. The first part of the course is based on lectures, visual presentations, as well as seminars. The second part is a practical activity carried out on the basis of scenarios, taking into account the varying degree of complexity of the issues, as well as the individual involvement of students. The medium used for activities is subject to the nature of the given assignment.
