Aim of the course	Students continue to develop their artistic consciousness, sensitivity and observation skills. Students practice various drawing techniques.
Prerequisites	Completion of the second year of studies. Ability to make a model study and quick sketches. Experience in looking for various forms of artistic expression.
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	The student has a good knowledge of drawing techniques. The student can talk about art, using art terminology. The student understands how important it is to look for his/her own form of expression in order for their drawing to have an artistic quality.
– skills	The student has advanced workshop skills. The student is able to create an original and interesting series of works. The student can make make quick sketches of any object.
– personal and social competence	The student understands the importance of showing his works to other people and to listen to their opin ions, but he/she also knows that he/she can disagree with them.  The student can hold a dialogue in both visual and verbal language.  The student can work in a group.
Course content	Similar to the first and second year, students make sketches of the human figure in order to practice their eye and hand and master their quick sketching skills.  Students make a model study, looking for their own artistic problems and solving them. They use differer tools and surfaces (not just paper).  Students' works made at home should become more characteristic and unique.  Students are also given one special task per semester.
	Students develop their ability to find inspiration for their own work. They study modern trends in drawing and improve selected drawing techniques, searching for their own artistic expression. Students learn how to present their works and work on their own projects.

	Classes are held in the studio, in the form of practical tasks, individual working critiques, and individual or team projects.
Assessment methods and criteria	The final grade is the sum of the following: 70% - regular reviews of works 30% - final review of works
