Aim of the course	The aim of the course is to acquaint the student with the fundamentals of culture sciences.
Prerequisites	The student has a general knowledge of the humanities at secondary school level, and a basic knowledge of the history of philosophy.
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	The student has an extended knowledge of the development history of culture sciences.
– skills	The student has the skill of logical thinking, associating phenomena, they can analyze and discuss the phenomena in the area of sociology and anthropology of culture. They can define problems, draw conclusions and associate facts. They can use their knowledge of the history of art and philosophy and put it in the context of cultural anthropology issues.
– personal and social competence	The student is able to reason logically and present their view, they see the need to analyze schemes, they can raise and solve problems.
Course content	The course covers the development history of culture sciences from anthropological evolutionism, through diffusionism, functionalism, structuralism etc. Having defined and discussed the history of cultural anthropology with its concepts, along with the concepts of the representatives of particular trends in culture sciences, the student will get familiar with selected problems of contemporary culture sociology. Particular emphasis will be put on the issues of cultural dynamics, as well as specificity of the phenomena such as, mass culture, subculture and counterculture, globalization and McDonald's trends in culture, as well as a multi-faceted phenomenon of evaluating and comparing various cultures (ethnocentrism, cultural relativism, multiculturalism and its understanding).
