<b>Aim of the course</b>	Getting familiar with the art of renaissance, manierism, baroque and rococo in Europe. Special emphasis on political context and social issues of that art, as well as its influence on spreading humanist ideas. Art as a means of religious and political propaganda. Teaching the student to recognize characteristic features of specific cultures. Developing analytical and critical skills regarding the heritage of past times.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	General knowledge of history resulting from secondary education.
<b>Learning outcomes:</b>	
<b>- knowledge</b>	Basic knowledge in the area of history of art.
<b>- skills</b>	Student has the ability to distinguish specific styles in the art of renaissance and baroque, including artworks by main artists; in painting, architecture and sculpture. Student can critically reinterpret historic forms when creating new visual qualities.

<b>- personal and social competence</b>	Student can analyze works of art regarding form and style, can form and express judgements about ancient works of art, student is aware of complexity of problems in shaping of specific historic epochs.
<b>Course content</b>	<p>Renaissance architecture: humanist ideas, return to antiquity in search for new architecture: projects of specific architects, examples of palaces and local styles (Venice).</p> <p>Renaissance sculpture: Florence and other examples of architectural sculpture, including grave sculptures, and garden sculptures.</p> <p>Renaissance painting: development of traditional and new styles of painting, mythology, history, portrait, landscape, religious paintings with examples from exceptional artists of a given era; frescos.</p> <p>Renaissance in Poland: sources of Polish renaissance, architecture and decoration, graves, church buildings, palaces, houses and homes, painting.</p> <p>Renaissance in Wrocław: architecture and ideological meaning, architectural sculpture based on selected examples.</p> <p>Mannerism: social, political and philosophical context; mannerism in the artworks by notable artists, mannerism in architecture, sculpture and artistic crafts, based on selected examples.</p> <p>Baroque architecture: ideological sources of a new architecture; reception of model examples, main artists who represent the baroque artistic expression, baroque in France, architecture in churches and palaces, Germany – urban architecture, England – definition, style, main examples.</p> <p>Baroque sculpture: Bernini and his influence on baroque sculpture in southern Europe, other main examples, French classical baroque, sculpture in Spain and Germany.</p> <p>Baroque painting: Caravaggio, Rubens, characteristic style features in various European regions, sentimental idealism, large frescoes, painting for monarchy and church.</p> <p>Baroque in Wrocław: church architecture, University of Wrocław, baroque houses.</p> <p>Rococo: spiritual climate of the epoch, main artists and their works, lifestyle of the epoch, architecture and decorations based on selected examples, sentimental garden.</p> <p>Baroque and rococo in Poland: urban architecture, castles, palaces, architectural sculpture, churches, portraits.</p>
<b>Course form and number of course hours</b>	Classes are in form of illustrated lectures, during which students are encouraged to analyze the examples presented. Visits to museum exhibitions and galleries.
<b>Assessment methods and criteria</b>	25% active participation in classes
