Aim of the course	Students practise their workshop skills and learn about composition and colour.
Prerequisites	Being open to diverse phenomena in culture and arts; being tolerant and dedicated; being creative.
Learning outcomes:	
– <i>knowledge</i>	Student has a basic knowledge of painting. Students knows the fundamentals of the painter's workshop and techniques. Student takes interest in other students' works, in the art presented in galleries and in the media. Student takes interest in art theory.
– <i>skills</i>	Student has basic workshop skills. Student can work regularly.
– <i>personal and social competence</i>	Student understands the importance of the communicative aspect of art. Student initiates a dialogue in the verbal and visual language. Student can give arguments to support his/her theses. Student can be a team member.
Course content	The studio is a space for master-apprentice interaction where students develop their visual and artistic awareness by means of assignment execution and looking for their own individuality. The study of painting involves the study of colour and composition, but it also focuses on finding one's own answers to the questions concerning the place and the aims of art.
Course form and number of course hours	Classes take place in the painting studio. Sculpture 6 hours/week, Art Mediation 4 hours/week Graphics and Printmaking 5 hours/week, Media Art 3 hours/week Art and Design of Ceramics 4 hours/week, Conservation and Restoration of Artworks 6 hours/week, Art and Design of Glass 4 hours/week Stage Design 4 hours/week, Interior Architecture 4 hours/week, Design 4 hours/week Students execute assignments such as still life, nude, topic assignment, or work on their individual projects. Students discuss their assignments with the tutors. The tutors give them their feedback, either on an individual basis or in group.
Assessment methods and criteria	The final assessment consists of: 1. working critiques – 60% 2. open critique of works – 40%
