Aim of the course	Teaching the students: - elements of composition, - skills of noticing proportions, - correct perception of space, - skills of building structures and solids.
Prerequisites	Completion of the first year of studies
Learning outcomes:	
– <i>knowledge</i>	The student: - develops a general artistic consciousness, - notices the variety of phenomena and trends in contemporary art and culture, - develops artistic sensitivity towards the world around, including the world created by the professor by performing various compositional tasks
– <i>skills</i>	The student: - creates their own artistic language allowing various relations with other disciplines, e.g. spatial installation, video, photography, comic, advertising etc., - can formulate their own artistic concepts, - can comment on their own works
– <i>personal and social competence</i>	The student: - gains verbal communication skills, - can work in a team, - can organise their work and present their work in public, - is sensitive to all sorts of social, political, civilisation and cultural phenomena
Course content	Individual work with each student based on student's own artistic ideas, homework, semestral tasks which aim at a wider understanding of drawing that reaches far beyond the issues from the previous year. The purpose is to shape and cherish adolescent artistic attitudes and to prepare students for independent artistic life.
Course form and number of course hours	Sculpture: 6 hours/week, Art Mediation: 4 hours/week Graphics and Printmaking: 5 hours/week, Media Art: 3 hours/week Art and Design of Ceramics: 3 hours/week, Art and Design of Glass: 3 hours/week, Conservation and Restoration of Artworks: 6 hours/week Stage Design: 4 hours/week, Interior Architecture: 4 hours/week, Design: 4 hours/week Classes in a studio, individual 'master-apprentice' classes, elements of a lecture, individual and group class and semester working critique, voluntary plein-air workshops.
Assessment methods and criteria	Class attendance, performing studio works and own works, attending reviews and tutorials, self-development and engagement. 50% executing assignments and active participation in classes 50% open critique of works, tutorials, reviews
