- <i>skills</i>	The student can independently analyze the artistic specialized text in English of a high degree of difficulty. They know rich vocabulary and apply it to expressing opinions on the issues related to ceramics, glass, drawing and painting in the form of both, writing and speaking.
- <i>personal and social competence</i>	The student can present their own artistic works. They can communicate in the scope of specific themes of art. They are prepared to take part in scholarship programmes and students exchange (Erasmus programme).
