Aim of the course	Students improving their workshop skills. Students creatively apply their knowledge and skills to produce new and original works.

Course form and number of course hours	Painting: 7 hours/week, Art Mediation: 8 hours/week Art and Design of Ceramics: 3 hours/week, Art and Design of Glass: 3 hours/week Interior Architecture: 3 hours/week, Design: 3 hours/week  Classes are held in the studio, in the form of practical tasks, individual or team projects, individual and group working critiques and consultations with the tutor, enabling students to learn to analyse and discuss their own artworks and those of their peers. (Methods: lectures, reviews or works, exhibitions)
