Prerequisites	Good manual skills, essential visual awareness, basic knowledge of painting techniques
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	The student: - possesses basic awareness of perceptual processes, - provides pictorial analyses of three-dimensional objects, - has basic technical knowledge and awareness of the function and expressive possibilities of the picture.
– skills	The student: -has good hand-eye coordination, -provides efficient pictorial analysis of visual sensations, -uses painting techniques effectively.
– personal and social competence	The student is sensitive to aesthetic aspects of the environment.
Course content	
Course form and number of course hours	10 hours/week
	Classes in studio: large-format painting studies of still-life or human body, individual topics assigned from the scope of problems (composition, chiaroscuro modelling and perspective). Individual 'master-apprentice' classes: a series of works of any character, including formal experiments performed independently by the students to develop their personal interests. Plein air workshops.
