Aim of the course	Development of creative thinking and artistic skills Building the student's artistic language based on the realisation of works of art with various painting techniques Selection of appropriate painting techniques
Prerequisites	Basic knowledge of painting techniques and an ability to use them Artistic consciousness and openness to various artistic phenomena
Learning outcomes:	
- knowledge	The student: - has basic knowledge of fundamental painting techniques, - forms their own opinions about contemporary and old art, - analyses various phenomena in nature, - perceives complex relations in nature in an artistically constructive way.
- skills	The student: - realises specific artistic exercises and selects appropriate means in their creations, - creates their own artistic expressions, - knows and understands various concepts in the area of fine arts.
- personal and social competence	The student: - works well in a team, - actively participates in classes, - expresses opinions and judgements about art, - understands and respects the beliefs of others.
Course content	Introduction to easel painting Issues connected with colour, form and composition Realistic study of still life Nude study Study of landscape painting Portrait Architecture Exercise in transposition of colours and experimenting with students' own interpretations of the abovementioned issues Realisations of the semester project assignment containing students' own, original concepts of painting Use of various painting techniques Analysis of form and ideas in students' painting works
Course form and number of course hours	Classes in the painting studio (10 hours a week). Individual reviews of works with a tutor Open critique of works held once a semester performed by a commission. Additional hours of plein air workshop are to be held.
Assessment methods and criteria	Final assessment is the sum of the following: 65% - working critique, active participation in classes, involvement 35% - final open critique of works
