Aim of the course	The goal of the course is to learn about basic questions of function, construction, technology and ergonomics of the furniture, as basic elements of further education. The teaching cycle and clause studies are aimed to shape a sentient and creative design of interior equipments.
Prerequisites	Basic knowledge of rules of composition, basics of geometry, ability to present one's concept using hand drawing.

Course content

Analysis of function, ergonomics and construction of a chosen furniture of wooden construction. Prepared analysis is also the initial data for one's own furniture design.

- Design a piece of furniture inspired by nature study of form, proportion. Searching for construction, suitable materials and visual expression of the designed object.
- Clause studies sketches on a given subject (during classes).
- Discussing selected, contemporary events and trends in the area of furniture design, as well as an analysis of existing examples in context of developing modern furniture design.
