Aim of the course	Further development of the student's broadly-understood consciousness, sensitivity and workshop skills and mastering them to perfection Making further attempts to formulate students' individual languages of artistic expression Unassisted formulation of artistic issues and their realisation in artistic practice First attempts of the original, completely independent artistic expression
Prerequisites	Completion of the 1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd year painting courses and the ability to solve arising problems effectively
Learning outcomes:	
– <i>knowledge</i>	The student has: - artistic awareness, - the knowledge of current artistic trends and their relationship with painting, - the awareness of the richness of phenomena and trends in contemporary art and culture, - the broadly-understood awareness of contemporary world issues and current social phenomena, - self-reflection on students' deliberate artistic choices.
– <i>skills</i>	The student: - professionally executes their works, - develops an individual artistic language allowing for a variety of relationships with other disciplines: spatial installation, video, photography etc., - makes independent artistic decisions, - formulates artistic concepts and comments on these concepts and student's own work, - choose means of expression according to the discussed and solved artistic problems.
– <i>personal and social competence</i>	The student: - has good verbal communication skills, - works well in a team, - organises their individual work and presents it publicly, - is sensitive to all the phenomena concerning nature, civilization and culture.
Course content	Further development of the student's artistic program depending on students' individual predispositions Choosing students' own topics and ways of realising them creatively and individually
Course form and number of course hours	9 hours/week Exercises, elements of lectures, individual and group working critique, semester reviews of works, extra-curricular plein-air painting
