Entity running the course	Faculty of Ceramics and Glass/Department of Conservation and Restoration of Ceramics and Glass
Entity for which the course has been prepared	
Course type	Specialty course, compulsory course, optional course.
Year of study/semester; Type of studies	Year V, sem. 9 and 10; full time master's degree studies
ECTS credits	4
Academic tutor	Prof. Kazimierz Pawlak (glass), Ph.D. Marta Sienkiewicz (stained glass), Ph.D. Maria Gąsior (ceramics).
Aim of the course	Preparing the student to work independently as a conservator and restorer of the works of art made of ceramics and glass. Execution of conservation and restoration of a historical object.
Prerequisites	The IV year classes passed.
Learning outcomes:	
- <i>knowledge</i>	The student has an advanced knowledge in the area of the developed research topic, including the history, execution techniques and also conservation and restoration of a selected historical object, the student is aware of the consequences of their actions taken in relation to the historical object.
- <i>skills</i>	The student has advanced skills in the area of working at ceramic and glass historical objects, they consciously use the conservation workshop and are able to make their own independent decisions regarding planning and execution of conservation and restoration works at the ceramic and glass historical objects, they can use in practice their knowledge on the methods and means of conservation and restoration, gained in the course of the study.
- <i>personal and social competence</i>	The student can independently present and discuss the entire course of the conservation treatment in the form of a public defend.
Course content	Consultations regarding planning and execution of conservation and restoration works at the historical object made of glass, stained glass or ceramics, chosen as the topic of the student's diploma project.
Course form and number of course hours	Consultations, 'master-apprentice' classes, individual projects. 30 hours/sem.
Assessment methods and criteria	Semester 9: 50% executing assignments, 50% active participation in classes. Semester 10: 75% executing assignments, 25% active participation in classes.
Assessment type	Semester 9: pass. Semester 10: graded pass.
Literature	Any available literature related to the topic of the realized project.
