<b>Academic aims</b>	The course is a component of instruction in the direction: MEDIA ART. The aim of the course is preparing the students for independent work with audio/video equipment and film lighting as well as developing fundamental skills in the area of film editing and utilizing software which supports this process.
<b>Module prerequisites</b>	No prerequisites
<b>Learning outcomes with respect to:</b>	
<b>– knowledge</b>	The student obtains fundamental knowledge from the area of Media Art in the field of: filming technique, image cropping, inter-frame movement, standard formats of audio/video materials, film editing as well as image compression.
<b>– skills</b>	The student obtains fundamental skills from the area Media Art within the range of: creating and reading storyboards, utilizing software for non-linear film editing. The student can independently prepare the set (prepare elements of set design, prepare lighting, plan actors' movements) as well as realize film shots.
<b>– personal and social competence</b>	The student can work in a film team, is able to correctly interpret the film script and present his/her own concept of the action and visual qualities of the image.
<b>Module content</b>	Workshop involving operation of filming equipment and film set lighting. Workshop involving intra-frame movement and realization of film shots. Workshop involving fundamentals of storyboard making. Workshop involving fundamentals of non-linear video editing. Workshop involving video editing.
<b>Module form and number of module hours</b>	Lectures and workshops, 45 hours / semester
<b>Assessment methods and criteria</b>	Percentage share in the final grade: 50% realization of assignments, active participation 50% critique of works realized during the workshop
