Aim of the course	To provide knowledge on the issue of the language of new media in art. To introduce basic concepts referring to the language of new media in art and discuss historical changes of its content. To present selected theories of the language of new media in art. To help students acquire the ability to identify the developmental characteristics of the language of new media.
Prerequisites	Basic knowledge of contemporary art, and phenomena of contemporary culture. Being open to diverse artistic attitudes.
Learning outcomes:	
– knowledge	 the student learns basic concepts and terms of the language of new media in art he or she learns about the history of the language of new media in art and gets acquainted with terms specific to the given areas of the language of new media in art. they learn to distinguish between innovative and typical forms of the language of new media in art
– skills	 the student learns to properly apply the learnt terms and ideas he or she is able to identify the linguistic measures used in a particular work, and to use proper terms to describe new media works they can conceptualize the issues and phenomena emerging in the field of new media art
– personal and social competence	 the student gains experience in expressing problems using discursive language and critically interpreting works of art, both individually and in a group the student uses the acquired knowledge to consciously conceptualize assumptions of their own artworks
Course content	The outline of new media output against a background of the changes of art in the 20 th century. The forming of the language of the new media. The language of classical photography and the transformation of photography into a digital medium. The forming of a new language exemplified by the differences between video and optical film at the turn of the 60's. The evolution of the language of video and the transformation of relations between video and film. The language of video-art: videotapes to videostreaming. The language of communication media art. Art and contemporary scientific discourse (bio art, genetic art, neuron webs).
Course form and number of course hours	The class is theoretical. The basis for it is the lecture showing abundant visual documentation, eventually turning into a discussion. The course takes place at the WRO Art Center's media library or the gallery. 1st semester: 2 hours/week, 30 hours per semester 2nd semester: 1 hour/week, 15 hours per semester
