| Aim of the course | The overriding goal of the course is for the students to gain knowledge and skills to shape their artistic expression in a formal and ideological manner, using practical exercises based on the observation of nature and regular in-depth work. The students have an opportunity to acquire skills allowing unassisted creations of their own images while demonstrating conscious artistic attitudes towards the existing work. The students have the ability to analyse visual problems from the ideological and formal point of view and they learn to use their emotions in artistic work. |
| Prerequisites | Correct vision (color-blindness not acceptable), manual predispositions, a sense of form and colour, passed entrance exam for the 1st year of studies. |
| Learning outcomes: |  |
| - knowledge | The student: <br> -has basic knowledge of fine arts, especially painting, <br> -knows the basics of composition, <br> -determines the range of colours, warm/cool, light/dark colours and the importance of an overall view of nature and still life. |
| - skills | The student creates simple, interesting, organised and harmonious painting compositions in a given range of colours, paying attention to warm/cool, light/dark colour attributes |
| - personal and social competence | The student: <br> - works well in a team, <br> - understands the need for individual work to acquire and deepen artistic skills. |
| Course content | Practical exercises in painting for the 1st year begin with basic composition of the painting and the rules determining the range of colours and colour attricutes (warm, cool, light, dark). The work based on nature and still life is an essential element of students' education. This includes works created under the supervision of the tutors in the studio (still life) and works created independently at home (still life, man, portrait, landscape, animals). A compulsory plein-air painting session is an addition to the program. |
